History of CONSTITUTION DAY

In 1952, President Truman signed a bill that moved "I Am an American Day" from the third Sunday in May to September 17th in order for the holiday to coincide with the signing of the U.S. Constitution in 1787. Congress renamed the holiday Citizenship Day. A joint resolution passed in 1956 requested that the president proclaim the week beginning September 17th thru September 23rd each year as Constitution Week.

The purpose of this holiday is to commemorate the creation and signing of the supreme law of our land and to honor and celebrate the privileges and responsibilities we have as citizens and members of our neighborhoods and communities. We understand by becoming more knowledgeable about the laws of our country, we are better able to respectfully debate and participate to advance the noble cause of freedom.

In 2004, an amendment recorded as Public Law 108–477 required all schools receiving federal funds to hold an educational program for their students on September 17th of each year honoring the signing of the Constitution.

At APA we are honored to celebrate the Constitution and our "American Ideals." We hope all families will read the U.S. Constitution this week and discuss the noble principles presented by our founding fathers.
