Math Counts

American Preparatory Academy is forming a Math Counts team for competitions beginning February of next year. Competitions are open to 6th-8th grade students who enjoy solving challenging mathematical problems. Students take a series of timed written tests, some as individuals, and one as a "team" of four. Those who score in the top 10 on these written tests are then invited to participate in a "countdown" round where questions are read orally and participants buzz in to answer. Student Check Out Procedures

Parents, please bring your ID into the school when checking out your students. Our front office staff may be asking you for your ID when you come to checkout your student. Please understand that it might take a few extra minutes to get your students and plan accordingly. If a student needs to be checked-in during the school day, the student must be accompanied into the school by an adult and checked in at the office. If a student needs to be checked-out during school hours, the parent/guardian must come into the school and sign the student out. Students will not be released from class until parents arrive at the school. For safety reasons, students will not be sent out to meet parents at the curb outside of regular carpool times. Please make sure the names of authorized individuals who are allowed to pick up a student from school is listed in the student's registration, and that they are prepared to show their ID. As always, when picking up your student before carpool pick-up times, please arrive 30 minutes before school dismissal to ensure the front office can get your student to the office before carpool begins. Thank you for your cooperation.
